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# Davis P.D. Requests Help from Chavez Parents

The traffic situation in front of César Chávez Elementary can be difficult and even dangerous. To make it as safe as possible for our children, the Davis Police Department is asking our help in the following areas. It's up to us to make drop-off and pick-up safe for our children by adhering to these traffic suggestions:

Walk or bike with your child to school whenever possible. If you do drive, come early to avoid the rush.

▶ NEVER stop in the bike lane or double park to drop off or pick up your child, or to wait for a parking space. If you can not pull all the way into a parking space (within 18" of the curb), drive on. DO NOT DOUBLE PARK.

**NEVER make a U-turn** in front of the school.

DO NOT park in front of the school. If you have to leave your vehicle for any reason, even for a short period of time, park down the street or around the block. The front of the school is a drop off and pick up zone ONLY, not a parking area.

S-minute loading zone-When you pick up your child in the afternoon and you do not see him/her waiting for you, drive around the block until a legal parking space opens up. Pull forward as far as possible to allow others in behind you. This helps the traffic flow and allows more parents access to the pickup/ drop off area.

Alternative options-Don't forget there are less congested options to access campus behind the school from Linden Lane and Maple Lane. Please remember to be considerate to the neighbors living on those streets.
