Welcome 7th Graders!

Holmes Junior High School welcomes our new 7th Graders for 2011-2012. As a welcoming gesture, this issue of the *Holmes Highlights* is being sent to the households of our incoming 7th grade families. Where Everybody Belongs

We are very excited that your child will be attending Holmes Junior High and we look forward to meeting your student at the WEB Orientation on Monday, August 22, 2011. WEB (Where Everybody Belongs) is an inspirational, high-energy program whose sole purpose is to help 7th graders feel more comfortable and help them achieve success in their first year of junior high school.

The WEB 7th grade orientation and transition program is designed to both welcome and support seventh graders by assigning them a ninth grade WEB Leader. WEB Leaders will mentor 7th graders through their first year at Holmes, both socially and academically. WEB Leaders were selected from a large pool of applicants and have met the qualifications of being good role models and positive leaders on our campus. 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*A Message from the Principal, Derek Brothers***The Year in Review**

This year has passed too quickly! We are preparing to enter a year of change with a reduced budget as a result of some decisions at the state and district levels. These decisions impact the 2011-2012 school year. The few changes that you can expect will be a few more students in each class and small loss of the familiar teachers that make Holmes a wonderful place to learn.

On a positive note, there have been so many accomplishments and successes to celebrate at Holmes this year. I would like to share some highlights with you here:

- 7th grade students began the year with increased confidence and comfort on campus thanks to the successful orientation and follow-up activities by the WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) program. Sixty 9th grade WEB leaders (under the direction of staff members Kerri Hogan, Caroline LaFlamme, Bill Williams and Cheryl Ozga) offered support and friendship to our new students as they made the transition to junior high.
- About fifty students representing diverse groups were trained as Holmes School Ambassadors who offer comfort to those who have felt disrespected and they try to intervene positively during conflict situations.
- All of our students enjoyed many types of assemblies including Teen Truth Live and Climate Change and the Civil War Reenactment.
- In April we heard from a motivational speaker named Keith Hawkins.
- Almost 300 7th and 8th graders were involved in Holmes athletics. Students had fun, learned to be both competitors and good sports and they showed tremendous growth throughout their seasons.
- Through the successful Unfundraiser Campaign the PTA has helped provide Holmes' students a chance to experience the Renaissance Period, to relive early American life and to experience the great outdoors.
- Students participated in several clubs during all-school lunches.
- Members of the student Mix-it-Up teams planned 3 special school wide lunch events where students participated in varied and fun activities with groups that were different from their usual friendships.
- Many other talented students played instruments or sang in remarkable musical concerts both at Holmes and the IPAB.

1. In June, your student will receive an invitation to the 7th Grade WEB Orientation.
2. A few days before orientation in August, your student will also receive a phone call from his or her WEB Leader personally inviting him or her to attend the WEB Orientation.
3. Your student is encouraged not to bring backpacks, purses, or other personal items as the day is quite active.
4. Make sure your student wears comfortable clothing that does not restrict movement.

The WEB Orientation is a student-only function, so we encourage you to let your child attend on her or his own. WEB Orientation and 7th grade registration are separate. Specific information about registration, including registration dates, will be sent to your home this summer. If you haven't received a packet by August 5, please contact the office and request one.

From the Attendance Office

Attendance Information

- By law, students must be in school unless they are ill or at a medical appointment.
- Parents should notify the school of any absence by 9:00 a.m. on the day of the absence. Call **757-5445** to report all absences.

Reporting Absences

- If you have been absent, you must hand in a note to the attendance office (the very next day you return to school) that has been signed by your parent/guardian indicating your name, date of absence, and reason for the absence OR have your parent/guardian call the attendance office with your name, date of absence, and reason for the absence. The attendance office telephone number is 757-5445.
- Unexcused absences will result in disciplinary action.

Leaving Campus during School Hours

- For your safety and by School Board authority Holmes is a closed campus.
- Students are not allowed to leave campus without permission.
- Before school, bring a note to the Attendance Office signed by your parent or guardian stating the time and reason for which you must leave.
- Pick up your off-campus pass and sign-out at the Attendance Office before you leave campus.
- If you must leave during the school day, an adult that is listed on your emergency card must pick you up.
- If you return to school before the end of the day, you must sign in at the Attendance Office.

Dress Code

The Davis Junior High Schools try to maintain a professional and friendly atmosphere in which teachers can teach and students can learn. While each student's mode of dress and grooming may be an expression of personal style and individual preference, a student's choices may affect the educational program or the health and safety of others. Our goals are to promote school safety and enhance the learning environment, while at the same time discourage distractions that inhibit learning. If a student's dress is not in accordance with this policy, any staff member may ask the student to make an appropriate correction.

Please take a few minutes and talk to your student about their clothes. With the warm weather here we are starting to see an escalation in the number of dress code referrals to the office. Thanks very much for your on-going support of our dress code.

Come Ride the 2011 Bike Loopalooza!

The 2011 Bike Loopalooza will take place on Sunday, May 22 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. This year's Loopalooza should be even bigger and better than the last! We hope to bring more than 250 children and their families out for a day of fun and exercise while educating them about the Bike Loop and bicycle commuting in Davis. There will be snacks, drinks, and merchandise for sale, as well as new prizes and activities on parts of the Loop. The 2010 Bike Loopalooza

In May of 2010, the Davis Bicycles! Schools Committee held the inaugural Bike Loopalooza. The purpose of the Loopalooza was to acquaint Davis parents and children with the Davis Bike Loop. The Bike Loop is a 12-mile bike trail that passes through many of the neighborhoods of the City of Davis. The route was established in 2007 through the efforts of Davis Bicycles! It is completely marked and paved with several miles protected from motor vehicle traffic. The Bike Loop provides a safe route to the proximity of seven of the nine elementary schools in Davis. The Schools Committee is promoting commuting to school by bicycle along the Bike Loop as a safe and fun alternative to commuting by motor vehicle.

The inaugural Bike Loopalooza attracted 173 young cyclists and their families. Riders started the Bike Loop at one of 11 stations, mostly located near one of the seven elementary schools near the Loop, and staffed by volunteers. Each young participant was given a Passport when he or she began the ride and received a stamp at each station. Sixty-one young people completed the entire 12-mile loop, collecting all 11 stamps in their passports! Each cyclist that collected 3 or more stamps received a Clif Z-Bar donated by Clif Bar & Company. Several stations also distributed other prizes such as spoke cards and bike pins donated by Davis Bicycles! and the City of Davis.

The 7th graders are just starting to study astronomy in science class and the trip was a great way to get students excited to learn about our universe. Included are instructions to complete necessary forms that need to be turned in on registration day in order for students to receive their schedules.

A new state law requires schools to have a copy of incoming 7th through 12th grade students' immunization records showing that they have received a Tdap vaccine after the age of 7. Students will not receive their school schedule at registration and will not be allowed to attend school until proof of Tdap is on file with the school nurse. Tdap protects against pertussis (whooping cough) which has reached epidemic levels in California.
